The "stragglers" know where to find us whenever they decide that the school, which molded their character and shaped their future, stands to benefit from their successes.

As usual, we shall convene in the month of July 2011 in New York. If the past is any guide, we shall expect quite a show from the Big Apple. They just don't know how to do things "small" in NY. From my little corner of the universe, I know that our organizational needs are plenty. But I trust that The Usual Suspects, working with New Yorkers, will make it yet another good year to be a member of CKC-AAA. Meanwhile, aluta continua.
